Who are we looking for?

- You are currently enrolled in a graduate-level degree programme both at the time of application and during the internship.
- You have completed at least three years of full-time studies at a university or equivalent institution towards the completion of a formal degree.
- You are at least 20 years old.
- You possess a first degree in a public health, medical or social field related to the technical work of WHO or a degree in management or administrative-related field.
- You are fluent in the working language of the office of assignment.

How can I apply?

- You are invited to create a profile in WHO's e-Recruitment system. This includes
 details regarding your education, current studies, language and computer skills.
- You are also encouraged to submit a cover letter to articulate your motivation for seeking a WHO Internship (maximum length - 3 paragraphs).
